Welcome to Year 1!

We hope you all have a fantastic and safe summer! We are very excited to begin the new academic year and start all the hard work whilst having lots of fun. LITERACY

This half term we will firstly be looking at *The Naughty Bus* by Jan and Jerry Oke. This book is all about a bus that gets into lots of mischief at home! As part of this book we will be role playing our own bus journeys and thinking of adjectives to describe beans! We will finish by creating our own story about what our own naughty bus might get up to in our local area! We will then read *Beegu* by Alexis Deacon. In this book we will create and describe our own alien, as well as writing our own poems. We will finish the half term with *Iggy Peck, Architect* by Andrea Beaty. We will be discussing thoughts, feelings and beginning to use conjunctions in a sentence. We will be focusing on the childrens imaginations whilst also working on writing simple sentences using punctuation and finger spaces.

Mathematics

This half term we will be using lots of practical activities and in depth discussion to introduce Birch class to Year 1 maths!

We will use a range of practical recourses such as wrapping paper and play dough to learn all about numbers 1-10. This term, we will also be learning how to sort objects into different groups and explaining our answers. During this time, we will be practising our conversation and discussion skills. We will also be discussing 1 more and 1 less in a number and using cubes and counters to demonstrate what happens when numbers become less or more.

Towards the end of the half term we will begin to look at addition in numbers 1-10 using part whole models. This will include lots of practical activities.

SCIENCE

This half term in Science we will be looking at 'Animals including humans'. As part of this topic, we will be beginning to look at our own human body and labelling our different body parts. We will then be using completing lots of different activities to learn about the senses and which sense is linked to which body part.


Other Curriculum Areas
