LITERACY

This term, we will be reading a range of books that link to our topic 'Deep in the Forest'. We will be reading *Cave Baby*, *The Gruffalo* and *Superworm*.

We will use these books to predict, label and describe using adjectives. We will also create a variety of fiction writing pieces, such as a story and a character prediction. We will also write a non-fiction instruction piece.

Whilst writing, we will continue to expand our knowledge and practise of conjunctions, capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

Mathematics

This term in maths, we will increase our knowledge of addition and subtraction. We will continue securing our knowledge and then using what we know to add and subtract within numbers 1-20. We will do so by using part whole models and a range of concrete resources, such as counters and ten frames.

We will also learn about place value within numbers up to 50. We will become familiar with all these numbers and discuss what is one less and one more within these numbers. We will also discuss how we write and order these numbers as words and numbers.




SCIENCE

carnivore, herbivore, omnivore, materials, properties, animals, humans.






Other Curriculum Areas

Deep in the Forest

Geography

This half term we will be focusing on Geography. We will continue to secure our knowledge of human and physical features, thinking about any of these features you might find in a forest.

Would a tree be a physical or a human feature? What about a hill or a lake? We will then compare these geographical features to our local area and in our own forest school. We will think about how our forest school is different to a real forest and will be using locational and directional language to describe features on a map.
