LITERACY

After a Viking raided our classrooms, we will be reading the books: 'How to Train a Dragon' by Cressida Cowell and 'Beowulf' by Rob Lloyd Jones. We will be inspired by the myths and legends of the Vikings and we will be writing some of our own, as well as exciting character descriptions and a diary. Beowulf was written about an ancient Viking poem, and we will use this as inspiration in writing our very own Viking Ode poems.

Mathematics

This term, we will continue learning about addition and subtraction and the relationship between them. Following that, we shall build upon our knowledge of length and perimeter. Later in the term, we will begin looking at multiplication again. You can help your child by practising all of their timetables.

Homework for Maths will be set using Mathletics on a weekly basis (Mondays). If your child requires computer access in school time, or you would prefer paper copies, please let us know.

PE-

SCIENCE

In Science, our topic will be 'Power it up!' and we will explore the world of electricity. We will consider the everyday benefits and uses of electricity, and conduct experiments to test our understanding and knowledge. We will explore creating circuits and, importantly, we will also be learning about the dangers of electricity and keeping safe.

Uniform - Thank you for ensuring your child has the correct school uniform - they look very smart. Reading - Year 4 pupils should be reading for 20 minutes every day. When reading with your child, encourage them to sound out tricky words using their phonics and discuss any unfamiliar vocabulary. Stop them regularly, to check their understanding, as this will support them with their learning. Some questions you could ask: what are the characters thinking/feeling? How do you know? Books will be changed regularly. If your child is not enjoying a particular book at home, help them find out what sort of book they might enjoy. This will help us choose books for them from our lovely library!
