LITERACY

As our topic this half term is South America, we will be looking at the novel 'Trash' by Andy Mulligan. The story focuses on two dumpsite boys living in 'Behala' in South America, who stumble upon something extraordinary. The story is adventurous and exciting and we are very excited to read this! When we are writing, we will be focusing on making sure we have a detailed adventure text that incorporates an ambitious setting description. We will be using expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials, and parenthesis. For our non-fiction text, we will be focusing on writing a balanced argument, thinking about arguments for and against an event that happens within the story.

Mathematics

Maths will look a little different this term! We will be using some fantastic videos prepared by White Rose Maths Team. They will explain all of the slides and invite you to pause the video and have a go at questions or even to have a think about the slides. They will also tell you when to answer questions in the Maths booklets which are available to be picked up from school.

This term, we will be mostly focused on multiplication and division. We will be building upon our skills learnt in Year 4 and moving onto multiplying even larger numbers and using a formal written method.

We will also be encouraging you at home to practice regularly on Times Tables Rockstars to develop your multiplication skills. There are lots of opportunities to challenge yourself and others – even to challenge your teachers!

Key vocabulary: Multiplication, equal, groups, lots of, product, division, sharing, grouping



SCIENCE

This term we will be exploring materials and properties. In class and at home, we will be conducting lots of experiments to help our understanding and to 'work like scientists.' All of the experiments planned will easily be able to be done at home with things that you might be able to find around the house, like glasses, paper, elastic bands and metal spoons.




Other Curriculum Areas

Uniform - Thank you for ensuring your child has the correct school uniform if they are in school. At home, it would be a great idea to get children up at normal school time and dressed ready to start their day of home learning.
