Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you are safe and well. You will by now be aware of the government's announcement that schools will open fully in England from Monday 8 March. Whilst we know that for the vast majority of you this will be a very welcome development, we also appreciate that for some it may also be a worrying time. Nonetheless, the government is clear that attendance is once again mandatory, so if you have any concerns about your child returning to school, it is important that you discuss these with us as soon as possible.

Across the Trinity Trust, each school has its own risk assessment in place. These detail the list of controls and protective measures in place to ensure they can operate as safely as possible, and we have spent the last week reviewing and updating them. Whilst it is important to remember that for most children, Covid-19 is a very mild illness, children can still carry the virus and pass it on to others, even if they have no symptoms at all. That is why our protective measures in school will remain in place for the time being.

We all know that it is very important that all children return to face-to-face learning and are able to benefit from the social and emotional aspects of school, along with their academic work and we are committed to ensuring we welcome all our pupils back in an orderly and safe environment. # **Routines**

We imagine you are into a well-established routine with home learning now, but it could support your child by starting to build in a routine that mirrors next week. Where necessary, start to re-establish bedtime routines and setting an alarm for the morning. Well-rested children will find it much easier to adjust to their return to school.

Both clubs are available to book via MyChildatSchool. Extra-curricular activities will continue to be postponed until further notice.

### Book bags, PE kits, reading books and homework planners

Your child will be able to bring these to and from school.

### Cleaning and hygiene

The classrooms and all areas of the school (surfaces, tables, chairs, door handles, equipment and toilets) will be cleaned regularly throughout the school day and a timetable is in place for this. Children will be reminded to wash or gel their hands regularly. In addition to this, there will be hand sanitiser in each classroom and in other areas of the school, including outside.

### **School Office**

The school office remains closed to parents/carers for the time being. If you need to contact school, please do not hesitate to ring or email and we will get back to you as soon as possible.

### **Child feeling unwell**

If your child feels unwell while at school, we will make sure that you are contacted straight away, so that you can collect him/her. Please remember that if your child is unwell and displaying any Covid-19 symptoms, or if someone in your household is displaying symptoms, you have a responsibility not to send him/her to school. It is also important that you inform the school if your child or anyone in your household tests positive for Covid-19 asap.

### Laptops

On Monday 8 March during drop off and collection, a trolley will be located in the playground for you to drop off any loaned laptops borrowed during lockdown. Please return these in a plastic bag, labelled with your child's name.

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#### Be positive!

If you think the return to school is something to be excited about, so will your child. Please contact school if you have any worries about the full reopening - we are here to help. Attendance is mandatory for all pupils from Monday and we really are delighted to be able to welcome them back.
