Attendance

Excellent attendance and punctuality is crucial to success. We encourage every child to aim for 100% attendance, maximising their learning opportunities and helping them to achieve their full potential.

Evidence shows that pupils who maintain excellent attendance achieve more, and make better progress – both academically and socially.

Pupil attendance is closely monitored, and unexplained absence will be followed up. This includes where pupils fall below our minimum attendance expectation rate of 95%.

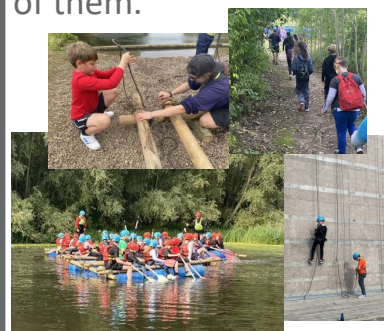
