From next term, we are changing the way we


teach writing in English lessons. We will be


using the tried-and-tested approach of 'The

The Writing Rainbow will be used in lessons to help children focus their idea for writing, develop their own unique style of writing and teach them the structures and tools that great writers use to engage their readers.

A small group of Year 3 pupils have been trialling this approach since January and we can't wait to see the impact it has on writing across the school.
