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RSPB 'Big Schools' Birdwatch

Years 1 & 2 have been taking part in the RSPB's Big Schools' Birdwatch, finding out which birds visit our school grounds. Following in the success of last year's Birdwatch, we joined thousands of other schools across the UK, counting the maximum number of birds we could see. The results have been surprising, with new species discovered and old favourites returning. In the Forest School area, we found magpies, blackbirds and woodpigeons to be our most frequent visitors, but we also saw robins, bluetits, redwings, chaffinches and beautiful goldfinches. Other species spotted in our school grounds include the collared dove, jenny wren and pied wagtail.



We made Tasty Pastry Maggots to tempt our visitors and put out trays of water when the ground froze. The children enjoyed watching the song thrushes in the oak tree, guarding the food by divebombing other visitors to the food trays. This proved to be a great strategy, until the big black carrion crows swooped in, scaring the other birds away!
